Sunny Corner Wind Farm Community  
Update – 13 March 2026

Hello Community Members,

The Near Neighbour Program for the proposed Sunny Corner Wind Farm has now concluded, and the project now moves into the next stage of planning and consultation. Thank you to all neighbours who expressed their interest, engaged with the project team and signed onto the program during the past eight months.

Over the course of the program rollout, the project and community teams have:

- Spoken to over 700 locals,
- Hosted five Community Information Hubs,
- Enabled Moir Visual Consultants to conduct photography at over 105 private dwellings, and
- Participated in discussions with almost two thirds of eligible neighbours.

The voluntary Near Neighbour Program was co-designed to share the financial benefits of the proposed wind farm with neighbours living in closest proximity to the project. Following feedback from the community we developed a tailored program to provide substantial financial benefits, with the option for accelerated payments, to eligible neighbours based on proximity and visual impact.

Thank you to everyone in the community for engaging with us in such a meaningful way and we now move into the next phase of the project.

### **Project timeline**

The proposed project is a State Significant Development (SSD) and requires a comprehensive Environmental Impact Statement (EIS) to be submitted to the NSW Department of Planning, Housing and Infrastructure (DPHI).

The EIS requires a number of detailed studies and specialist assessments which are currently underway. The EIS will be placed on public exhibition as part of the planning process.

### **Community consultation opportunities**

The next formal opportunity to provide feedback will be in the public exhibition phase of the EIS for the proposed Project which is expected later this year. We encourage all stakeholders and community members to engage in this process and provide their feedback on the EIS and assessment outcomes.

In the meantime, we welcome questions and feedback at any stage. Our team remains available for ongoing conversations, including face to face meetings when helpful.

The Project developers, Someva and Mainstream Renewable Energy, will continue to seek input from the community on how the proposed Sunny Corner Wind Farm can provide the greatest benefits to local residents, communities and other stakeholders.

## Positive business interest

Since releasing 25 work packages for the project through the Industry Capability Network (ICN) Gateway portal, we have received a strong and encouraging response including a wave of Expressions of Interests submitted by local businesses. It's great to see such a positive response across services ranging from earthworks, concreting and steelworks to electrical work, logistics, catering, cleaning, accommodation, crane operations and transport.

We are keen to partner with as many local suppliers and contractors as possible. Local businesses can learn about the 25 work packages and continue to submit Expressions of Interest via the ICN Gateway.
